This beautiful home was built in 1948 for the family of a pastor whose church was in the neighborhood. There were several other owners who all were engineering faculty members. Mary and Darryl Vines then bought the home in the early 1990's and lived there until 2011. Mary and Darryl wanted the home to remain with a family and one that was affiliated with Texas Tech.

Ryan and Kelly Williams then purchased the home and wanted to maintain the traditional feel of the house but update it to meet the needs of their family. The kitchen and living areas were the main focus of the renovation, combining the separate areas into one large area letting in the southern light. They carried out the board and batten feature that was evident in other parts of the home. The kitchen has shaker-style cabinetry and molding evoking a farmhouse feel with the clean lines. The tiles in the kitchen and other areas have been inspired by their foreign travels bringing the family's interests into their home. An antique grand piano, circa 1920's, belonging to the paternal grandmother sits proudly in the parlor area. Other family antiques are located throughout the house. On an interesting note, there are three pieces of art on loan from the Charles Adams Gallery that are for sale to the public.
