You will love this delightful, warm, comfortable home, owned by Peggy and Terry McInturff. The house was originally built in 1940. Peggy and Terry bought the house in 2006. Prior to that, the house had been rented out to students for quite a while. Immediately they freshened and repair the entire interior and added the master bathroom on the back SE corner of the home. They renovated the kitchen in 2010.

Every part of this house has a loving, family touch.

Every ornament on the tree at the entrance were by Great Aunt Plum. Aunt Plum lived in a hotel in El Paso and spend much of her time making these ornaments. Take a close look at her affectionate touches.

In the front bedroom, on the north wall, is a painting done by Terry's great-grandmother in 1880 - a painting of Lil Red Riding Hood. The beautiful and intricate quilt on the bed was quilted by another of Terry's great grandmothers. We're not sure of the name of the pattern but are certain that one of you will be able to tell us.

As you head to the back bedroom, don't forget to check out the pajama warmer drawer in the hallway. A very clever adaptation by Peggy, you'll all be inspired to have one by the time you get home!

In the living room, against the west wall, is a buffet/secretary Peggy inherited from her grandmother. This beautiful piece is original to England, built in 1810. Even more fun are the treasures you will find within, a collection of nativity scenes Peggy keeps out year-round. And almost every piece is invested with family. One scene was painted and finished by Terry's mother, another by his grandmother. Another piece finished by Peggy's mom. Every piece has meaning and depth to it.

Above the fireplaces in the living room and the den are Christmas stockings made by Terry's mother.

The newest addition, just completed this fall, is the grandchildren's room. A dream of Peggy's since her first grandchild was born, she's created a room just for her four lovely grandchildren - Weston, Caroline, Torie and Carlie.

Notice the camp style Peggy created with the bunk beds, the cedar wall, the furniture. Each bed has a pillow with their initials monogrammed on it. On the east wall are pictures of each grandchild, doing some of their favorite activities. The small table was bought by Terry's mom for his daughters, now it's used by their grandchildren. The rattan furniture came from Peggy's grandmother. The painting above that set was done by a Lubbock artist in 1923. A genuine labor of love and great affection.

The final parts of the house are the favorite spaces of Terry and Peggy (of course, if their grandchildren are visiting, every space is a favorite space). The back room is comfortable and inviting. The back patio, perfect for Lubbock in spring, summer and fall - is their most frequent place to relax. And one more final touch for their grandchildren, in the backyard, Wisteria Cottage.
